Welcome to May and the final seven weeks of the 2023 - 2024 school year! These next seven weeks are always a time of celebration at RHS. We are excited to celebrate our Class of 2024 as they conclude their high school careers and move on to the next phase of life and adulthood with our Graduation Ceremony on June 6. Our annual Awards Night put on by National Honor Society and many other year-end activities and celebrations will be occurring as we close the school year on a positive note. Please make sure you pay attention to our school communications so that you are aware of all that is happening here at RHS.

With the end of the school year in mind, I do want to remind all parents to make sure you are utilizing the Parent Portal to monitor their student's attendance and grades. Every year we engage in reminding our students that school ends on the last day of the school year, Wednesday, June 12, and that they are expected to participate in class and their schoolwork until that point. Help us in that task by checking the Parent Portal and discussing grades and attendance (particularly tardiness) with your student. Did you know that in the Parent Portal if you click on a teacher's name you can message them directly? That if you click on their grade in a class you can access the teacher's gradebook and see the score on every assignment, including what may be missing? Please utilize these tools and if you need assistance with the Parent Portal, contact us.

I have to take some of this space to congratulate Ms. Meade and the RHS Drama Society for an outstanding job on their Spring Production of the Willy Wonka Musical. It was a great performance that highlights all of the outstanding ability our students at RHS (and all of those elementary-aged Oompaa Loompaas) have. I hope you were able to attend one of the performances and enjoyed the show!

Senior Parents: Here are some important reminders for you as your senior closes out their time at RHS to ensure that their final few weeks are successful. Our celebrations will come with the graduation ceremony itself, and these reminders should be paid attention to so that all seniors reach their credit requirements and are able to walk across the stage.

- All seniors must pass a full year of English 12.
- All Credit recovery must be completed by Friday, May 10.
- Seniors' exams start Monday, May 20.
- Roseville Community Schools Policy is that all students must pass 2 of the 3 markings that make up a semester grade to receive credit. (3rd quarter grade, 4th quarter grade, final exam - must pass 2 of 3).
- Senior's Last Day is May 22. All Seniors must successfully complete the Senior Checkout Procedures to be eligible to participate in Graduation.

- All fines must be paid (including any laptop fines) and/or laptop, bag, and charger must be returned to receive cap and gown prior to graduation. A cap and gown is required to participate in Graduation.

- RHS will be having a Senior Celebration Event on Campus from 5:00 pm - 9:00 PM. Ticket cost is \$15, and they can be purchased in the Main Office. More details are available on the next page.

A REMINDER TO ALL SENIORS:

If you owe ANY classes on credit recovery—those MUST be completed by MAY 10th or you WILL NOT GRADUATE!

Credit Recovery is assigned when you have failed a class that is **REQUIRED** to earn your diploma.

You have required classes and you need to attain a minimum number of credits (that means passing 'elective' classes as well)

In addition, any senior who is not on track for graduation and/or still has not completed credit recovery will not be allowed to attend Prom.

2023-24 GRADUATES - Reminders about TIP and FASFA

What is TIP?

- The Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) Phase I encourages students to complete high school by providing college tuition assistance after graduation toward a certificate or associate degree. (Think free community college tuition for 2 years!)
- After Earning a certificate, associates degree, or 56 transferable credits, the student can then be eligible to receive TIP Phase II, up to \$500/per semester while pursuing a bachelor's degree, not to exceed \$2,000 total. (at this point you can transfer to a 4-year university)

Do you know if you are enrolled in Medicaid?

- If so, then you might be TIP eligible!
- Students enrolled in Medicaid for at least 24 months within a 36 month period between age 9 and high school graduation may be eligible.

What are my next steps to ensure I receive TIP funding if I am eligible?

1. Create your student portal account as: <https://www.michigan.gov/missg>
2. Get your FSA ID at <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch>
3. Complete your 2024-25 FASFA application at: <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>
4. List the school you will be attending first in the first spot on your FASFA (ie: Macomb Community College)
5. Apply to the school you have listed on your FASFA.

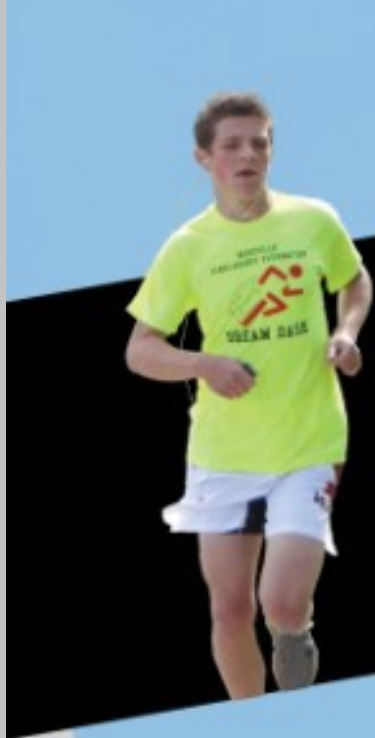

Top Tips for Adopting SAFE & HEALTHY ONLINE HABITS

Everyone has so much going on in their lives, and that includes children: from exams and deadlines to anxiety and mental health struggles. It's quite easy to send memes, make jokes and vent online about the things that irritate us, but when was the last time you – or your child – took a moment to share something kind or positive instead? In fact, when did you last stop and think about your family's online activities? To help keep them safe and teach them healthy online habits, we need to develop our children's digital resilience. There are lots of ways that children can become more digitally resilient, and we've pulled together some popular strategies here...

WHAT IS DIGITAL RESILIENCE?



Resilience doesn't mean being so tough that nothing gets to you, and it's not about "putting up with things" either. Instead, it's the ability to recover from setbacks. Everyone feels sad, worried, scared or upset at times: it's how we respond and adapt to those situations which is important. Digital resilience is about making choices that keep us safe and happy online, even when we're exposed to something negative or upsetting. Building your child's digital resilience will help reduce the impact of potential risks as they engage with and navigate around the online world.

MAKE POSITIVE LIFESTYLE CHOICES



- Make time for the people and things that make you happy.
- Monitor your screen time and stick to your limits.
- On social media, follow people that make you feel good about yourself – and unfollow the ones who don't.
- Spread some positivity: post good reviews, leave encouraging comments and share good news.

KEEP YOUR HEALTH IN MIND



- Try to factor in regular breaks offline and away from your screen – ideally, outdoors for some revitalising fresh air.
- Exercise is a brilliant stress-buster: even a walk around the block, a bike ride or a stroll to your local shop can really work wonders.
- Be strict with yourself about putting devices away in plenty of time before bed: they can interfere with a good night's sleep, which is essential for staying healthy.

REACH OUT FOR SUPPORT

- If you have a problem online, don't be afraid to reach out to specialist people or organisations that could help.
- Follow people on socials who have the same values and morals as you.
- You could always talk to a friend, or a trusted adult like a teacher or family member for some advice.

PUT SAFETY FIRST



- If you see something online that upsets or worries you, tell a trusted adult about it as soon as possible.
- You could also report the content that's making you feel uncomfortable to the site or app that you saw it on, so they can look into it.
- Another option is to block the person or the account that's causing you a problem – or you could go one step further by totally deleting the app you were using.

GET THINGS CLEAR IN YOUR HEAD



- Ask yourself what kindness online actually looks like. Can you remember the last time someone was kind or supportive towards you online? What did they do?
- Think about how it makes you feel when someone sends you a positive or funny message online.
- What about the opposite: has someone ever been deliberately unkind to you online? What did they do and how did it make you feel?
- If someone's behaviour online is causing you stress, try to remind yourself of all the steps you can take if a person's being unkind online.

i Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

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If you aren't receiving text messages, especially our Sunday 3pm text AND/OR accompanying email, our weekly feedback report shows it is because the receiving end has either blocked or unsubscribed from our text OR email service. PLEASE do not 'opt out' or 'unsubscribe' or 'block' the text messages and/or emails!

Dear Parents and Students of the Class of 2024,

The following is essential information regarding seniors and graduation. Please read below and retain this document so you can reference it for dates, times, events, and procedures. Paper copies are available at the RHS Security Desk at Door #1 for parents who want one.

For convenience, events are listed in alphabetical order and there is a calendar of events at the end of the document.

Class of 2024 Graduation Celebration: The event is open to the RHS Class of 2024 ONLY. no friends or family. Saturday, June 1, 2024, 5:00 p.m. to Sunset (approximately 9:00 p.m.).

The event shall be themed as a Backyard BBQ, we will have Food Trucks, Music, a Dunk Tank, Inflatables, Yard Games, Corn Hole, Cam Jam, Staff/Student Games, a complete Field Day Event, plus MORE.

The cost of this event is \$15. No tickets for this event will be sold after Friday, May 31, 2024.

Tickets can be purchased from Mrs. Jentz in the Main Office starting Tuesday, April 23rd. We will have a RevTrack Online Payment link available soon.

Parent chaperones are still needed and will have to have a completed Volunteer Application for the current year on file.

CREDIT RECOVERY: Seniors who are taking credit recovery courses after school must have all coursework completed and submitted for a grade by **Friday, May 10th**.

EXAMS: Seniors will take exams on Monday, May 20th, and Tuesday, May 21st. Senior exams must be completed, and all schoolwork will be due at the end of the school day on Wednesday, May 22nd.

Reminder: RCS policy is that students must pass 2 of the 3 grading elements in a semester to receive a passing semester grade and credit for a class.

FINES/FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS: **All fines must be paid in full to receive a cap and gown and walk at graduation. No exceptions.** All fines must be paid in full by Friday, May 24th. This includes laptop fines, outstanding books, athletics, music, drama, and band items/uniforms. Unsure if your student has fines? GRADUATION ANNOUNCEMENTS: Jostens will be at RHS on Friday, April 12th during all three lunches. Senior graduation announcement orders (**NOT CAP & GOWNS**) will be given to those students who ordered them. **Josten's balances must be paid in full to pick up announcement orders.** Please contact Jostens at 248-946-4670 with questions.

GRADUATION CAP AND GOWNS: Cap and gowns will be distributed on Monday, June 3, 2024, from 4:00 p.m.-5:30 p.m. in the Main Cafeteria. Enter through the Athletic entrance (door #24). **All fines must be paid in full to receive your cap and gown. No exceptions.** Seniors who do not pay fines or complete Senior Checkout will receive their cap & gown the day after the graduation ceremony and cannot participate in graduation.

Graduation Cap & Gown Parade: **NEW** this year, only open to members of the Class of 2024. We will have a last parade/walk for any Senior who wants to participate. On June 4th, report to the cafeteria, through Door #24 (Athletic Entrance) at 9:20 a.m., and bring your Cap & Gown. We will give you time to robe up, review a couple of items, and then proceed to have your last walk (parade style) throughout the building, as our final farewell to recognize your accomplishments. All Seniors will then leave the building by 10:00 a.m. Members of the Class of 2024 **MUST** bring their Cap & Gown to participate. Due to security reasons, no outside guests are allowed to attend this event due to school being in session.

Seating is general admission. Outside guests are allowed (*with approved guest application*). **Prom is for seniors and their guests only.** Any guest who is not a current Roseville High School student must have an approved and signed guest application. Applications are available in the student's Assistant Principal's office and are due no later than Thursday, May 9th. **Guests must be no older than nineteen, and no younger than 9th grade.
