Student Handbook

Each student at Roseville Junior High School will receive a handbook and a daily planner book. **Please review the handbook with your child.** It will answer many questions and will save time in the long run. Special concentration is recommended in the areas relative to dress code and attendance, as these areas can greatly affect students' grades. Teachers will also be reviewing the handbook with your child during the first week of school. Students are responsible for knowing the information within.

Absences

If your child is going to be absent from school, it is important to remember that you call in his/her absence. The phone number is 445-5610. Notes will not be accepted. You have three (3) days to call in an absence or it will be recorded as an unexcused absence. (Refer to the handbook for a more detailed explanation.) In keeping with Michigan Law we will be keeping track of (and reporting) those students who miss too much school to the county truancy officers.

Please be aware that two tardies equal one absence!

Picking Up and Dropping Off Students

Below are our procedures for picking up and dropping off students to ensure that they (and our staff members) are safe. All picking up and dropping off of students will be done in the horseshoe drive off of Barkman. **On the first day only**, 7th graders will enter through the main entrance, 8th graders will enter through the cafeteria entrance, and 9th graders will enter through the Martin Rd. entrance. All bus pick ups and drop offs will be done in the Martin Rd. parking lot. No vehicles (other than buses and those belonging to staff members) will be allowed in the Martin Rd. parking lot. For the remainder of the year students being dropped off by parents must enter the building through the main entrance. Please pull up in the horseshoe drive as far as possible so the cars behind you will not back up on Barkman. Do not drop your child off at the door if you can pull up farther, as you will only make your wait longer.

Be advised that Roseville police will issue tickets to cars that are stopped on Barkman or Martin to drop off or pick up students.

Please be aware of what is around your car and give our students the right of way. Together we can ensure the safety of our students.

Asbestos Compliance

Roseville Community Schools have complied with Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, commonly referred to as AHERA. AHERA provides framework for addressing asbestos problems in public and private elementary and secondary schools. The regulations provide a comprehensive scheme for schools to access and respond to potential asbestos problems in their buildings.

The compliance was carried out by:

1. Having all buildings inspected by an accredited inspector.
2. Developing an asbestos management plan for each school and submitting a copy to the Governor.
3. Providing copies of the report and management plan which are on file in each of the school's administrative offices and can be viewed by any interested party.
4. Re-inspecting all school buildings every six months.

Lunch Program

We have two cafeterias, one for hot lunch (students purchase their lunch) and one for cold lunch (students who bring a lunch). They will eat in one or the other, but cannot move back and forth. The first lunch will be served on September 3, the first full day of school. The cost of lunch is \$2.75. Please make sure your child has either a lunch or \$2.75. For your information, the cost of breakfast is \$1.75 and milk is still \$.50.

Tips For a Successful Year!!!

- Help your student get organized for school. This may include purchasing a trapper-keeper or ring binder with indexes, pencils, pens, and spiral notebooks.
- Work out a study plan that both you and your student can live with. You may want to include the times and amount of studying that your student will do per day and where the studying will take place. A quiet place without interruptions such as television or music is preferred. Your child will have homework!!
- Don't forget that students are required to read their textbooks and re-view their notes regularly as well as study for tests. This is also homework!
- Look for your student to bring home books on a daily basis, if you don't see any books, contact the teacher before it is too late in the card marking to salvage poor grades.
- Most of our teachers have well over a hundred students to try to keep track of. If you have any questions or want to check on your student's progress, do not hesitate to contact our staff. You can leave a message for them at 445-5600 and they will return your call within 24 hours in most cases.
- Do stay involved in your student's education in grades 7-9. These years of adolescence are among the most difficult and important for both students and parents. Junior High students need your guidance more than ever!
